Dillan Head Receives Prison Sentence for Retail Theft Scheme to Steal High-End Vacuum Cleaners

DENVER — Denver District Attorney John Walsh has announced that Dillan Head was sentenced today to six years in prison for stealing high-end vacuum cleaners and then selling them online for money or drugs. In March, Head pleaded guilty to one count of robbery.

Prosecution: Quality of Life Crimes

Denver DA and Denver City Attorney

- Area Restrictions ullet
- Trespassing and Trespass Agreements

AREA RESTRICTIONS IN STATE CASES (DM1 and DM2)

Do you want an area restriction on this defendant?

- a. Is this person a consistent problem in this area?
- b. Is the area restriction reasonably related to the offense?
- c. Have you gotten a lot of citizen / community complaints about this person?
- d. Does this person consistently ignore trespass warnings / citations?
- e. Remember, an A.R. cannot be just for punishment.
- f. Does the person live or work in the area? If so, we can still do an A.R. but we'll have to be creative about the parameters.
- g. Overall, give us a good, solid reason as to why this person needs an A.R.

П. Writing the P.C. statement

- a. Put the A.R. request right on the complaint at the end of the PC narrative.
- b. Give us as much information as you can to support the request.
 - i. Examples would be things like "this is D's third shoplifting contact at this location," or "[this defendant] has been warned/trespassed/been a problem at this location for six
 - months"; or
- "this store is one of the top three shoplifting problem locations in the District"; iv. Then add "area restriction requested for the following parameters: c. You are giving the prosecutors and the judge reasons to issue the A.R.
- d. What geographic area?
 - A block area: "500 900 block of 16th Street mall and 17th to 14th Street" ii. Certain parks: "Civic Center Park"; "Skyline Park", etc.

 - iii. General: "Auraria Campus"
 - iv. The area description needs to be specific so the A.R. is enforceable and gives the person clear notice about where they cannot be
