

## **Updated Restroom Sanitation Protocol**

- You need to practice safe social distancing. Take your time and use your best judgement and remove yourself from the situation if it seems like you cannot maintain the correct distance from the general public.
- Bring a change of clothes and shoes. Bag up the clothes you used for the day including shoes and launder at earliest convenience. There is a washer/dryer in the weeds bay if you choose to use one on site. You'll be paid for your time so please record it.
- Wear your safety glasses all day! We can also provide goggles or a face mask to reduce the chance of liquid splash back when spraying the disinfectants on surfaces. These can be provided if you desire. Please reach out to Will directly if you'd like them.
- Wear a face covering/mask. These can be found on the BHP room table.
  - Guidance for Extended Use of Facemasks (surgical/procedure masks)
    - Perform hand hygiene. Remove the procedure mask by holding the ear loops. The front is contaminated, so remove slowly and carefully.
    - After removing facemask, visually inspect for contamination, distortion in shape/form. If contaminated or wet the mask should be discarded. If the facemask is NOT visibly contaminated or distorted, carefully store in the paper bag to avoid destroying the shape of the mask.
    - The facemask should be stored in a dedicated, well-ventilated container (i.e., paper bag with handles) with user name & date.
    - A disposable facemask can be worn for several hours if not wet or distorted.
      All masks are to be disposed of at the end of the shift.
- Disinfect EVERYTHING before/during/after your shift including dash, door handles (inside and out), radio knobs, shifter, bucket, seat, keys, safety glasses (shades) and anything else you may have touched.
- Wash hands with water after every stop: buckets, soap, and water will be supplied in the bed of trucks.
- Apply nitrile gloves after exiting the truck.
- Spray down door handling, garbage/recycle cans, gates, bike racks, and anything else people might be likely to touch. (Lysol or 700 spray) This needs to sit for at least 10 minutes to kill Covid19 and Norovirus.
- After waiting the appropriate time go back to RR door, spray it down again, wipe it down and open it. Spray inside door/handling, sanitizer dispenser, grab bars, toilet paper dispenser, seat/riser on both sides of RR.
- Go back to the garbage cans, spray again, and wipe down.
- After waiting the 10 minutes, go back to the RR, spray down again, and wipe down everything.

- Bag paper towels in separate trash bag, spray down gloves, and dispose in same bag.
- Wash hands with soap and water, use hand sanitizer, and get back in the truck. BOOM!! You're clean.
- At the end of the day treat the vehicle and cleaning supplies as if they were a RR. Spray down, bottles, bucket, box of gloves, seats etc. (see truck instructions above) with Lysol or Waxie 700 (blue stuff). Tie and toss trash bag with paper towels/gloves, bag clothes and shoes, wash up in shop sink or showers if you choose, and put on clean clothes and shoes.
