














































Various (Legal) Water Worlds

- Rights to Divert and Use Water From Streams and Aquifers
- Water Quality Regulation
- Storm Water Drainage
- Infrastructure and Distribution Systems
- Recreational Access



Rights to Divert and Use Water From Streams/Aquifers


- What is this about?
 - Allocating a scarce and unpredictable resource
 - Policy goal is to create certainty
 - Rights allocation system
- How does this apply to municipalities?
 - Water supply for treated and raw water use





Water Quality Regulation

- What is this about?
 - Managing pollutants for health/safety, environment
- How does this apply to municipalities?
 - Treated water supply
 - Wastewater treatment
 - Stormwater
 - Recreation





Water Quality Regulation

- Colorado Water Quality Control Commission / Division is the main agency.
- Interplay between federal law and state law
- No affect on water rights
- Regulations are frequently updated





Storm Water Drainage

- What is this about?
 - Managing precipitation runoff and potential changes to runoff patterns
- How does this apply to municipalities?
 - Stormwater utility
 - MS4 permits





Storm Water Drainage


- Preservation of Historical Runoff Patterns
- Water Quantity Aspect
 - No capturing water beyond Senate Bill 15-212 without a water right
- Water Quality Aspect
 - MS4 permits





Infrastructure and Distribution Systems

- What is this about?
 - How to convey water from its source to place of use.

• Ditch and Reservoir Company Systems





Infrastructure and Distribution Systems

- Municipal Systems
 - Federal and State permitting
 - Treated water distribution system
 - Graywater





Recreational Access Rights

- What is this about?
 - How to acquire access to streams and reservoirs for recreation







Recreational Access Rights


- Access rights for recreation must be acquired separately
- For reservoirs, rights controlled by reservoir operator; situation-bysituation analysis is needed
