The meeting was called to order by President Massey at 10:00 a.m. Attendance was taken and a quorum was established.

John Marriott MOVED AND Dave Frank SECONDED A MOTION TO APPROVE THE MINUTES FROM THE JANUARY 24, 2025 MEETING. The motion passed unanimously.

TaShina Salas, Denver Regional Director for U.S. Senator John Hickenlooper was welcomed and introduced to both staff and board members. She gave a brief update on Hickenlooper's priorities, answered questions, and provided an update on the status of previously approved Congressionally Directed Spending (CDS) requests and the prospects for CDS in 2025. Finally, she expressed the importance of members reaching out to their regional offices with questions and local updates.

Allison Wright, Finance and Administration Manager, provided an update on the current municipal dues as well as year-end financials.

Heather Stauffer, Legislative Advocacy Manager, and the Advocacy Team summarized recommendations from the February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2025 CML Policy Committee meeting and the supplemental action items. HB25-1237 Liquor: Soft Close for Bars and Taverns, was pulled for a separate discussion and vote.

Dave Frank MOVED and Amanda Sawyer SECONDED THE MOTION TO APPROVE THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE POLICY COMMITTEE AND STAFF AS PRESENTED EXCLUDING HB25-1237

WHILE INCLUDING THE SUPPLEMENTAL ACTION ITEMS. The motion passed unanimously.

John Marriott MOVED and Laura Weinberg SECONDED THE MOTION TO ACCEPT STAFF RECOMMENDATION OF NEUTRAL ON HB-25 1237. The motion passed with two dissenting.

Seth Hoffman asked the legislative team about the status of HB25-1112, Local Authorities Enforce Vehicle Registration, and if staff had considered whether CML should have a position on SB25-161, Transit Reform. Staff provided the latest information on the vehicle registration legislation, and the Board discussed the transit reform bill. Staff agreed that the bill should be presented to the Policy Committee at its next meeting.

Kevin Bommer, Executive Director, gave an overview of the upcoming NLC Congressional City Conference (CCC) scheduled from March 9-12, including the activities scheduled on Capitol Hill for Colorado attendees.

Bommer shared Dave Frank was interested in being reappointed to the Colorado Opioid Abatement Counsel (COAC). Hollie Rogin MOVED and David Kerber SECONDED THE MOTION TO SUPPORT. The motion passed.

The meeting adjourned at 12:19 p.m.
