Lone Tree City Manager elected CML secretary/treasurer

DENVER, COLO. – Thursday, July 6, 2023 - The Colorado Municipal League (CML) announced Seth Hoffman as the newly elected Secretary-Treasurer for the 2023-2024 term. Hoffman was elected as secretary/treasurer by his peers on the CML Executive Board immediately following the election of 11 new board members at the League's Annual Business Meeting. Hoffman currently serves as the City Manager of Lone Tree, bringing extensive experience and a strong commitment to municipal leadership.

Hoffman's tenure in public service began when he was named City Manager for the City of Lone Tree on November 1, 2013. Prior to assuming this role, he held various positions within Lone Tree since 2005, including Deputy City Manager and Economic Development Director. Throughout his career, Hoffman has successfully conducted expansion, retention, and relocation negotiations on a multitude of high-profile projects, including Kaiser Permanente, Charles Schwab, Health One, and Cabela's. His exceptional skills in fostering economic development have made a lasting impact on the community.

As City Manager, Hoffman serves as Lone Tree's Chief Appointed Official, providing professional leadership to a range of departments including Police, Finance, Economic Development, Administrative Services, Public Works, Arts Center, and Community Development. He plays a pivotal role in implementing the goals and policies set forth by the City Council, ensuring efficient and effective governance.

"Seth's proven track record of effective and professional city management, along with his commitment to community well-being make him an excellent choice for the position of Secretary-Treasurer," said Kevin Bommer, executive director of CML. "His leadership will further strengthen CML and empower Colorado cities and towns."

Joining Hoffman in leadership roles on the CML Executive Board are Jessica Sandgren, mayor pro tem of Thornton, who was elected as president, and Wynetta Massey, city attorney of Colorado Springs, who was elected as vice president. Dale Hall, Greeley councilmember, will serve as the immediate past president.

The CML Executive Board is comprised of 21 elected officials and key municipal staff members who are elected by CML members at the League's annual business meeting. The executive board is responsible for developing, articulating, promoting, and supporting CML's vision, mission, goals and strategic plan, as well as to frame and focus policy discussions and establish League positions consistent with CML's Annual Policy Statement.
