Rivero elected secretary/treasurer of the Colorado Municipal League's Executive Board

DENVER, Colo. – Friday, July 10, 2026 – Parker Mayor Joshua Rivero was elected secretary/treasurer of the Colorado Municipal League (CML) Executive Board at CML's 104th Annual Conference that occurred in Westminster on June 24. Rivero will serve in this role through June 2027 and represents the Board's large population category of 50,000 to 249,999. He was reelected to the Board at the conference, and his two-year term runs through June 2028.

CML is a nonprofit, non-partisan organization representing and serving Colorado's cities and towns: 270 towns and municipalities are members of the League. The [21-member Board](#) is responsible for the overall finances, management, and policy direction of the League.

Rivero, owner of Fika Coffee House and Idyllwilde resident since 2006, brings a wealth of experience to the Board. He previously served as a Parker Town Council member from 2012-2020. In addition to his role with the League, Rivero is actively involved in the community having also served as president of the Downtown Development Council, a precursor to Parker's Downtown Business Alliance.
