CML Executive Board members elected

DENVER, Colo. – Friday, July 10, 2026 – Municipal officials from around the state elected representatives to the Colorado Municipal League (CML) Executive Board during CML's Annual Business Meeting, held in Westminster on June 24 during the organization's 104th Annual Conference.

CML is a nonprofit, non-partisan organization representing and serving Colorado's cities and towns: 270 towns and municipalities are members of the League. The [21-member Board](#) is responsible for the overall finances, management, and policy direction of the League.

During the conference, the League published its [2025-2026 annual report](#) that outlines not only the organization's budget but also its training and policy initiatives. During the 2026 legislative session, CML tracked 218 bills. CML helped defeat 17 bills as well as secure amendments for 18 bills. Seventeen of the 30 bills CML supported passed.
