While **SB23-286** did pass, the provisions of the bill that CML objected to, which included CORA research and retrieval fee exemptions for the media and mandated itemized estimates and receipts for CORA research and retrieval fees, were removed before the bill was introduced. After securing several more amendments, CML was able to remove the opposition position we took on the bill.
