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Five Preparedness Missions of the U.S. Department of Education



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Community Perceptions of School Safety*

- 50% of community respondents reported satisfaction with the level of school preparedness for any safety incident (Educators 75%)
- 50% of community respondents reported agreement that their schools are prepared for a wide range of safety issues (Educators 75%)
- All groups reported being most concerned about active shooter events at schools
- However, all four groups report in the last 5 years they had seen incidents of bullying, weather, drugs or alcohol and physical abuse more than any other incidents.

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What are some suggestions for how communities can help?

Prevention:

- Are community mental health resources readily available to all?
- Have emergency responders and others under your purview been trained in Mental Health First Aid?
- Do you have the Colorado Crisis Services & Colorado Child Abuse Prevention posters and other materials prominently displayed in public areas?
- Are community activities designed to include all stakeholders so that everyone feels a sense of belonging?

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What are some suggestions for how communities can help?

Mitigation:

- Have first responders connected with all schools in your community?
- Have other entities reached out to schools to offer services prior to any emergencies?
- Have community drills been conducted including school personnel?

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What are some suggestions for how communities can help?

Protection:

- Have emergency responders had the opportunity to review the school's emergency plans and offer feedback?
- Do community members understand why schools have taken safety measures such as requiring all visitors to check in, wear name badges, and perhaps even move polling places from school buildings, etc.

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What are some suggestions for how communities can help?

Response:

- Do schools feel they can contact their emergency responders even when it isn't a full scale emergency.
- When a school has a student suicide, does the community see this as an opportunity to support the school with a community response?

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What are some suggestions for how communities can help?

Recovery:

- Would you have community businesses that would step in and offer assistance with resources after an incident?
- Would community partners be willing to participate in gatekeeper training after a student suicide?
- Does your office have any influence in helping the local media report incidents in ways that don't risk student safety?
